Additional Degree Requirements

1. Students earning an AST degree must meet the following:

^{*}For transfer to APSU, ETSU, UM, UTC, and UTK, Math 1530 is required. At UTM and TSU, Math 1130: College Algebra is required.

^{**}Neither University of Memphis nor UT Knoxville has Development of Exceptional Children in its Pre-K-3 Curriculum and students transferring to either University of Memphis or UT Knoxville will have to take one other course after transfer.

^{***}Students who plan to transfer to UT Knoxville should take an Intermediate foreign language instead of MATH 1410; University of Memphis does not require completion of MATH 1410.

^{****}Students who plan to transfer to ETSU should take EDUC 2210 Education Psychology instead of MATH 1420.
